

Naloxone Course Enrollment Instructions


And Troubleshooting Guide

For best results:

- Apple Safari browser is not recommended – you will have to re-enter the course each time after visiting outside links.
- Phone display characteristics vary – completion by desktop/laptop recommended
- Local printer settings vary greatly – be prepared to take a screenshot or “print” to PDF to retain your completion certificate.
- Attempt with a stable wifi or hardwire web connection. Users with low quality cell data or poor connectivity will experience freezing and buffering of audio and video
- You may have to adjust display setting for optimal viewing.



